WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

This course is designed for anyone in the fields of: Crisis Intervention, Disaster Response, Education, Emergency Services, Employee Assistance, Healthcare, Mental Health, Business & Industry, Military and Spiritual Care.

The 3-day GRIN course combines ALL of the components of ICISF's Individual Crisis Intervention [Peer Support] & Group Crisis Intervention courses.

Crisis Intervention is NOT psychotherapy; rather, it is a specialized acute emergency mental health intervention which requires specialized training. As physical first aid is to surgery, Crisis Intervention is to psychotherapy. Thus, Crisis Intervention is sometimes called "emotional first aid"

Designed to present the core elements of a comprehensive, systematic and multi-component crisis intervention curriculum, this course will prepare participants to understand a wide range of crisis intervention services for both the individual and for groups. Fundamentals of Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) will be outlined and participants will leave with the knowledge and tools to provide several group crisis interventions, specifically demobilizations, defusings and the Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD).

Certification

Workshops are taught in accordance with the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation (ICISF) standards. Resource workbooks published by ICISF are provided to participants. Certificates from the ICISF will be awarded at the end of the session.
